Keeping Safe During COVID-19



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INTRODUCTION

As you can certainly appreciate, the current global pandemic makes it necessary to carefully prepare for travel to and arrival in Canada.

Please take some time to review the information in this package. By not following this protocol, students may be denied entry into the country. Government authorities may also fine students for non-compliance in certain situations.

Our top priority is the health and safety of our students, faculty, staff, partners, and community. We are obligated to follow the regulations and recommendations of the Canadian and provincial governments, and the local public health authority. This includes recording the flight information and self-isolation plans for all of our arriving international students; you must send us this information before departing your home country.

At the end of the document is the COVID-19 Travel and Arrival Protocols Declaration.

This document, along with your flight information and self-isolation plan, must be signed and sent to **Justine Higgs – Student Services** at **justine.higgs@lasallecollegevancouver.com** before you leave your home country.



DEFINITIONS

Below you will find COVID-19 vocabulary. Please become familiar with these terms.

Social/Physical Distancing

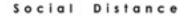
Keep at least 2 meters between you and others. Avoid crowded spaces and places.

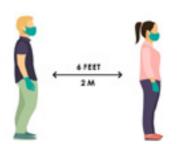
Self-Isolation and Quarantine

Stay in a place in isolation to prevent exposing others or yourself to COVID-19.

Self-Monitoring

Check your health for possible symptoms of COVID-19.











PRE-DEPARTURE

Communication and Relationship Building

If you will be staying in a homestay, contact your host family to get to know each other. A video chat using Zoom or Skype is a good way to do this. Remember to exchange emails and cell phone numbers with your host family.

If you will be staying in a residence/dormitory/hotel, please ensure that you have the correct contact information for them, as well as for any private transportation service that you may be using.

You should also enter the LaSalle College Vancouver telephone number into your cell phone.

Household Isolation

Before you leave your home country to come to Canada, it is recommended that you self-isolate in your home for 2 weeks and only meet your immediate household members during that time.

Covid-19 Testing and Mandatory Hotel Quarantine

As of January 7 2021, students must present a negative Covid-19 test prior to boarding a flight to Canada. The test must be performed using a COVID-19 molecular polymerase chain reaction (or PCR) test and must be taken within 72 hours prior to your scheduled departure to Canada.

As of February 21, 2021, students are also required to:

- Reserve a government-authorized hotel for 3 nights prior to departure to Canada.
 - To book your mandatory 3-night hotel stopover, call 1-800-294-8253 (from within North America) or **1-613-830-2992** (collect call from outside North America)
- Take a COVID-19 molecular test on arrival in Canada
- Stay in the government-authorized hotel to wait for the results of the COVID-19 molecular test taken on arrival
- Pay for the cost of the hotel stay, as well as all associated costs for:
 - food
 - security
 - transportation
 - infection prevention and control measures

Travellers must present proof of having reserved and pre-paid for their accommodation through ArriveCAN. Travellers will still be required to complete the remainder of the mandatory 14-day quarantine after their mandatory hotel stopover.

NEW UPDATE AS OF JULY 5, 2021

Exemptions for fully vaccinated travellers who meet specific conditions.

You may qualify for certain exemptions to quarantine and testing requirements if you: are eligible to enter Canada are asymptomatic meet the Government of Canada requirements of fully vaccinated travellers meet all other entry requirements, including entering your information in ArriveCAN before arrival.

Those who meet the requirements may be exempt from:

- → Quarantine
- → Hotel stopover (for air travellers)
- → Day-8 testing requirement

Accepted Vaccines:

- → Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine
- → Moderna COVID-19 vaccine
- → AstraZeneca/COVISHIELD COVID-19 vaccine
- → Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) COVID-19 vaccine single dose

Vaccines not currently accepted for fully vaccinated status in Canada:

- → Bharat Biotech (Covaxin, BBV152 A, B, C)
- → Cansino (Convidecia, Ad5-nCoV)
- → Gamalaya (Sputnik V, Gam-Covid-Vac)
- → Sinopharm (BBIBP-CorV, Sinopharm-Wuhan)
- → Sinovac (CoronaVac, PiCoVacc)
- → Vector Institute (EpiVacCorona)
- → Other

The list of accepted vaccines may expand in the future.

Entering Canada by AIR during COVID-19

Travellers entering Canada must follow the rules set out by the Emergency Orders under the Quarantine Act to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 and its variants. Failure to comply with any requirements or providing false information may result in fines, penalties or imprisonment.

If symptoms develop, tell your flight attendant immediately.



Your quarantine

Go to your pre-booked hotel to await results of your arrival test.



If negative:

Continue on to your place of quarantine. Complete your test kit as instructed.

Relocate to a designated quarantine facility or other suitable place of quarantine. Follow instructions as provided.





Use ArriveCAN or call 1-833-641-0343 to check-in the day after you enter Canada and to report symptoms dailv.

You will be contacted by Government of Canada and provincial/ territorial officials.

Fully vaccinated travellers entering Canada during COVID-19



Effective July 5, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. ET

If you are fully vaccinated and meet specific requirements, these new measures may apply to you. Fully vaccinated means having received the full series of a vaccine or a combination of <u>vaccines accepted by the Government of Canada</u> (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Janssen) at least 14 days prior to entering Canada.



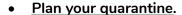

- Pre-register for your arrival test.
- Within 72 hours **before** your arrival to Canada:
 - Take a COVID-19 molecular test
 - Use <u>ArriveCAN</u> to enter your information
- Have your ArriveCAN receipt and documents ready, including digital or paper copy of proof of vaccination.

- Provide required information and documents, including proof of vaccination, if requested.
- Answer all eligibility, vaccination and health screening questions.
- Complete your arrival test on site if services are available. Otherwise, collect a home test kit to use when you arrive at your destination.
- If you have symptoms or do not meet the exemption requirements, follow the instructions provided by the government representative.

- If you meet all the entry requirements and are fully vaccinated, you are exempt from:
 - quarantine
 - government-authorized hotel (air travellers)
 - day 8 test
- If you got a home test kit, complete and send it to the lab.
- If your arrival test is positive, you must follow the instructions of your local public health authority, including quarantine or isolation.
- Keep your proof of vaccination for 14 days.









What you need to enter into ArriveCAN:

- Contact & travel information
- 14-day travel history
- Quarantine plan
- Confirmation of a negative pre-entry test (or positive test taken 14-90 days prior to travel)
- Proof of vaccination (must be in English or French, or a certified translation)
- COVID-19 symptom self-assessment

Packing

Include the following in your carry-on bag:

- → Proof of reservation at government-approved hotel for 3 nights.
- → Passport
- → Study Permit or Study Permit Approval Letter
- → Custodianship Documents (if required)
- → Letter of Acceptance
- → Host Family Profile with contact information (if applicable)
- → Residence/Dormitory/Hotel information (if applicable)
- → Private transportation service information (if applicable)
- → Complete BC Self Isolation Plan Form
- → Medical clearance letter (if you have one)
- → COVID test results (if you have them)
- \rightarrow Copy of this document signed by yourself (and your parents/guardians if you are under the age of 19)
- → 2 masks, 3 pair of gloves, travel-sized hand-sanitizer, disinfecting wipes.
- → Change of clothes
- → Snacks







ARRIVAL PLANS

Before you leave your home country, you must download the ArriveCAN app from the Government of Canada and complete a mandatory Self-Isolation Plan for the Government of British Columbia. Both of these need to be complete prior to your arrival in British Columbia.

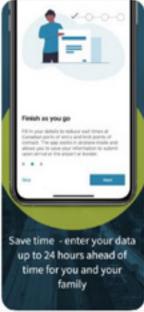
ARRIVECAN APP

The ArriveCAN app is available for iPhone and Android and can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play. This app must be setup before you arrive at immigration in Canada because the immigration officer will provide you with a TOKEN NUMBER you will need to enter.



Here are the steps to setup the app:

















BC GOVERNMENT SELF-ISOLATION PLAN

Before you leave your home country it is very important that you complete the BC Government Support for International Travelers Self Isolation Plan form. When you arrive at the airport you will be asked to show this form, and the information must be correct.

If you need assistance in filling out this form, please ask **Justine Higgs – Student Services** at **justine. higgs@lasallecollegevancouver.com**. On the next page you will see an example of the form.

Your personal information as well as those of your household is collected by the Ministry of Health under the authority of sections 26(a), (c), (e) and s. 27(1)(a)(iii) of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, the Public Health Act and the federal Quarantine Act, for the purposes of reducing the spread of COVID-19. Remember to wear a mask at all times. Wash your hands before you board the airplane.

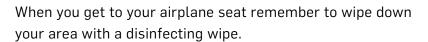


Practice Social Distancing

It is important to try to keep your distance from other people. You should try and keep at least 2 meters from other people.

Keeping Safe

Keep your cell phone charged in case you need to contact your host family, your accommodation provider, your transportation provider, or LCV. Bring some snacks in your carry-on bag because the restaurants in the airport may not be open.











ARRIVING IN CANADA

You finally made it! We are sure you are excited to begin your Canadian educational experience at LCV. Ensure you have printed copies of the following documents ready for when you go through immigration:

- → Passport
- → Study Permit or Study Permit Approval Letter
- → Custodianship Documents (if required)
- → Letter of Acceptance
- → Non-discretionary travel support letter (if provided by LCV)
- → Host Family Profile with contact information (if applicable)
- → Residence/Dormitory/Hotel information (if applicable)
- → Private transportation service information (if applicable)
- → Complete BC Self Isolation Plan Form
- → Medical clearance letter (if you have one)
- \rightarrow COVID test results (if you have them)



Before leaving your home country, you will need to have arranged and paid for a 3-day stay in a government-approved hotel by calling **1-800-294-8253** (from within North America) or **1-613-830-2992** (collect call from outside North America). You also need to have arranged safe, private transportation from the hotel to your accommodation after your mandatory stay – traveling on public transportation is not allowed until you have completed the mandatory 14-day quarantine period. If you are staying with a host family, make sure you know whether they will be picking you up at the airport, and where to meet them. If you are staying in a residence/dormitory/hotel, they may be able to arrange airport pick up for you; ensure you know where the meeting point is. **Justine Higgs** from Student Services (**justine.higgs@lasallecollegevancouver.com**) will be able to assist you with making these arrangements, if needed.



SELF ISOLATION/QUARANTINE

Government Rules and Communication

You have finished your mandatory hotel stay and received a negative test result and now are heading to your new home! In British Columbia everyone has worked hard to keep COVID-19 manageable. We did this by following some important rules from the government. When you get to your new home you must self-isolate for the remainder of your 14 days. This means you must stay in your room and avoid direct contact with your host family or other guests in your residence/dormitory/hotel. You cannot leave your accommodation for the remainder of the 14 days. If you are staying with a host family, they will provide you with food, cleaning supplies, etc. If you are staying at a residence/dormitory/hotel, they will have arrangements for food and supply delivery, laundry service, etc. Information about this will be provided to you in advance.

The governments of Canada and British Columbia want to make sure all new arrivals to Canada are safe and healthy. To do this they will call you or your host family to make sure you are self-isolating and following the law. You must be prepared to answer calls from 1-855-906-5585 or 613-221-3100.

A staff member from LCV will also contact you to ensure that you are self-isolating, and also to offer any support that you may need during your self-isolation. Please be sure to check your email regularly, and also to answer any telephone calls from LCV.

Student Responsibilities for Homestay

To keep you and your host family safe while you are self-isolating, it is important that you stay in your room. You are able to leave your room to go to the bathroom. Remember to keep your room clean and practice good hygiene. Some examples are washing your hands often, showering every day, cleaning the bathroom after using it, covering your mouth and nose with your elbow when you cough or sneeze, and keeping your room clean.









WHAT TO DO DURING SELF-INSOLATION

Physical Health

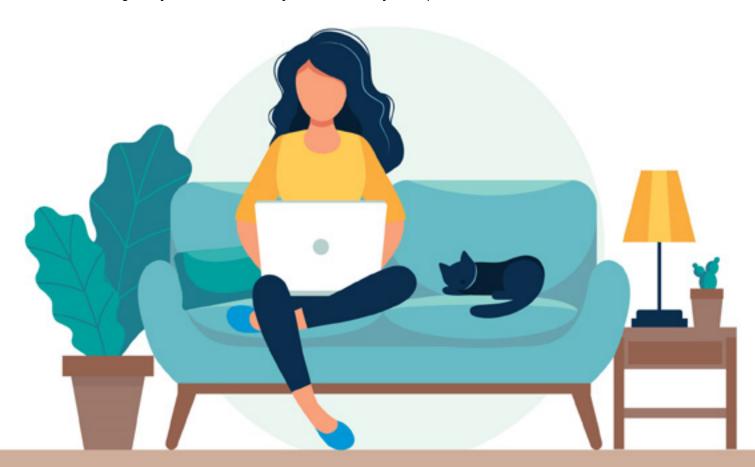
Staying active during self isolation! This is a great opportunity for you to try a new exercise routine, such as yoga. It is important to make sure you establish a healthy routine as quickly as possible. Try to go to bed at a reasonable hour and don't stay up all night, so that you can adjust to the time zone in Vancouver and keep your immune system strong.

Monitor your Mental Health

Being in a new country is exciting but being in self-isolation may be challenging. Communicate with your host family or with LCV's Student Services regularly and let them know how you are feeling. We are all here to support you!

Stay Connected

Contact your friends and family when you are self isolating. Check with your host family or accommodation provider to make sure you have access to wi-fi. It is important to check your email regularly because LCV may need to send you important information.

☐ Book and pay for a 3-day stay in a government-approved hotel by calling 1-800-294-8253 (from within North America) or 1-613-830-2992 (collect call from outside North America)
☐ If you will be staying with a host family, contact them in advance to discuss expectations, and make sure they have a current photo of you
☐ Provide arrival information and exchange contact information (cell, email)
☐ Read How to self-isolate after travel when you live with other family members and Daily Self-Monitoring form for COVID-19
□ Complete, send and print the online Mandatory Self-Isolation Plan (https://travelscreening.gov.bc.ca/), and send a copy to Justine Higgs – Student Services at justine.higgs@lasallecollegevancouver.com

☐ Download the ArriveCAN App (iOS and Android)

COVID-19 TRAVEL AND ARRIVAL PROTOCOLS DECLARATION

We look forward to welcoming you to LaSalle College Vancouver. This document must be signed and sent to **Justine Higgs – Student Services** at **justine.higgs@lasallecollegevancouver.com** before you leave your home country.

Self-Isolation is a requirement of the Quarantine Act and is not optional. Students who are in private homestay arrangements, residence/dormitory/hotel, or are staying with family or friends must self-isolate for 14 days after arrival in Canada. By signing, I have read, understand, and agree to comply with the expectations listed in this document. I understand if I do not follow these expectations, I risk being dismissed from the program. Students (and parents/guardians of students under the age of 19) are responsible for any fines incurred due to breach of the Quarantine Act and regulations from the Government of British Columbia.
