Information for students beginning a program of study at  
LaSalle College Vancouver in the Spring 2021 quarter



## **1 IF YOU ARE CURRENTLY LIVING IN THE VANCOUVER AREA...**

### **A And your program includes an on-campus course(s) in the Spring 2021 quarter, then;**

- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your on-campus course(s), and you will be required to read, acknowledge, and follow LCV's COVID safety protocols
- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your online (remote) course(s); please note that these day(s)/time(s) may be scheduling placeholders - remote courses will typically have some synchronous and some asynchronous components, which will be explained by your instructor in the first week of class

### **B And your program does not include an on-campus course(s) in the Spring 2021 quarter, then;**

- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your online (remote) course(s); please note that these day(s)/time(s) may be scheduling placeholders - remote courses will typically have some synchronous and some asynchronous components, which will be explained by your instructor in the first week of class

## **2 IF YOU ARE ELSEWHERE IN CANADA...**

### **A And your program includes an on-ground course(s) in the Spring 2021 quarter, then;**

- You will be required to travel to Vancouver before April 5, 2021, factoring in any additional time that may be required for self-quarantine after arrival
- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your on-campus course(s), and you will be required to read, acknowledge, and follow LCV's COVID safety protocols
- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your online (remote) course(s); please note that these day(s)/time(s) may be scheduling placeholders - remote courses will typically have some synchronous and some asynchronous components, which will be explained by your instructor in the first week of class

### **B And your program does not include an on-ground course(s) in the Spring 2021 quarter, then;**

- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your online (remote) course(s); please note that these day(s)/time(s) may be scheduling placeholders - remote courses will typically have some synchronous and some asynchronous components, which will be explained by your instructor in the first week of class

### **3 IF YOU ARE OUTSIDE OF CANADA...**

#### **A And you have received an approval letter for a Canadian study permit...**

You should make arrangements to travel to Vancouver before April 5, 2021, factoring in any additional time that may be required for self-quarantine after arrival (currently 14 days); Please check with your immigration consultant or the IRCC website for immigration details and any changes to the current COVID-related travel restrictions: <https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/coronavirus-covid19/students.html>

##### **► And your program includes an on-ground course(s) in the Spring 2021 quarter, then;**

- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your on-campus course(s), and you will be required to read, acknowledge, and follow LCV's COVID safety protocols
- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your online (remote) course(s); please note that these day(s)/time(s) may be scheduling placeholders - remote courses will typically have some synchronous and some asynchronous components, which will be explained by your instructor in the first week of class

##### **► And your program does not include an on-ground course(s) in the Spring 2021 quarter, then;**

- You may have the option to attend the LCV campus for access to resources, equipment, student support, etc.. In this case you will be required to read, acknowledge, and follow LCV's COVID safety protocols

- You may begin your program of study from outside of Canada
- You will be informed of the day(s) and time(s) for your online (remote) course(s); please note that these day(s)/time(s) may be scheduling placeholders - remote courses will typically have some synchronous and some asynchronous components, which will be explained by your instructor in the first week of class

If you have any questions about whether or not your program will include on-campus classes, please contact your Admissions Advisor. In some (but not all) cases it may be possible to register you for alternate classes that do not require on-campus presence during the Spring 2021 quarter.
